Dear Parents,

As we move into the final quarter of 2006-07, I would like to take a moment to thank all of you for your continual support of Wheaton North High School. With spring comes summer - and the end of the school year. We sadly say goodbye to our seniors. As their principal, I have been so impressed with their leadership and loyalty to Wheaton North. We also welcome the Class of 2011 to our mailing list. This is the **last issue** of the Falcon Focus for this school year, so please keep it as a reference.

We have so many things to celebrate at Wheaton North. Many of our co-curricular groups made it to the state level this year. The boys basketball team was Regional champions, the Speech Team placed 3rd in the state and Colin Delaney was state champion in Original Comedy, Eric Terrazas placed 3rd in the IHSA Wrestling individual meet, our Falconette dance team took 5th in Hip Hop at the IDTA state contest, the Scholastic Bowl team brought home the 2nd place trophy, and finally our Math Team qualified the jr/sr 2-person team and the jr/sr 8-person team for the ICTM State Contest on April 28. In addition to co-curricular celebrations, senior Becca Ross was selected one of 100 Illinois Golden Apple Scholars, and social studies teacher Donna Wielgolweski received an IMSA Award of Excellence for Teacher Recognition. **We have so much to be proud of in this great school!**

As in the past, I want to take the opportunity to express my gratitude on behalf of Wheaton North High School to the **Falcon Booster Organization**, under the leadership of Al Ernst, Joanne Fahrforth, Deb Willems, and Karen Cervenka. The Falcon booster organization put on another successful Falcon Booster Dinner Dance Auction. Thank you to the committee co-chairs Al Ernst and Anna Yeganegi, the committee members, and the many members of the community who gave of their time and financial support in order to raise money for our many programs at Wheaton North. As principal, I am so very grateful for all you do on behalf of our students.

Springtime is an exciting time in a high school. As you read through the Falcon Focus, please make note of the many upcoming events. As previously noted, April 25 - 26 are the **Prairie State Achievement Exam** dates for all juniors. Day 1 is the ACT and Day 2 is the ISBE test. Together the scores combine to give the PSAE score. Dear Falcon Parents,

As our year begins to wind down and our Junior/Senior Prom approaches I would like to cover a few topics that I believe are pertinent to a successful prom weekend.

I first would like to remind everyone that prom is extended to Juniors and Seniors only, and that any student that wants to bring a guest that is not a Wheaton North student, needs to have a guest form completed in order to purchase tickets. All guests need to be approved by you, as well as your student's dean. I would also ask that the female students attending this year's prom be aware that some dresses are not appropriate. If your daughter, or date's guest, has a dress that you feel may be considered inappropriate by administration, please have them bring this concern to their dean to avoid any conflict on the evening of the dance.

The last issue concerning prom weekend is the self-proclaimed "senior ditch day" that is usually held on the Monday following prom weekend. This year's past Turnabout dance resulted in 205 seniors and 100 juniors being called in as excused from school on the Monday following the Turnabout Dance. I want all parents to know that the "ditch day" is not acknowledged by Wheaton North, and is not considered an excused absence by our faculty or administration. We strongly encourage all parents to only excuse their son/daughter due the legal reasons stated in the Illinois School Code that can be found on page 17 of your son/daughters student handbook. While we realize that students can be excused by their parents, it is our hope that students are receiving the highest level of education, which is difficult for teachers to facilitate when we accumulate such a large number of absences in classrooms.

Prom is an exciting and enjoyable evening for all of our students and staff that attends. We have been fortunate to avoid any major problems at our proms in the past, and that is a tribute to the strong family support we have at Wheaton North. I appreciate your help in the issues I have stated above, and feel free to contact me if you have any questions.

Student Schedule Changes for 2007-2008

FYI- according to the Illinois Department of Public Health, a health examination, completed within 1 year prior to the first day of attendance, is required for all children entering ninth grade. Physicians licensed to practice medicine in all of its branches (Medical Doctor or Doctors of Osteopathy), advanced practice nurses (APN'S) and physician assistants (PA'S) who have a collaborative agreement with a physician are allowed to conduct and sign a health examination. **The completed 9th grade physical is part of the required registration packet and due no later than July 2, 2007.** The policy of District 200 is to allow a student to participate in physical education classes only when a completed physical examination is on file in the nurse's office.

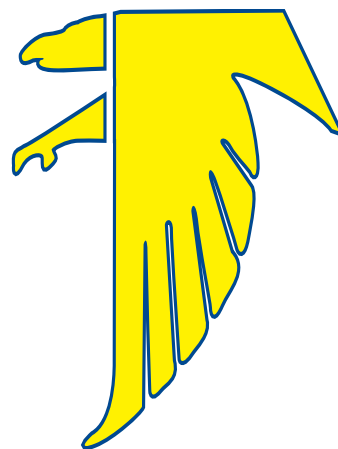
