A Message From The Principal...

Dear Parents,

Welcome to the 2005 - 06 school year. It is hard to believe that a new school year is just a few short weeks away. **This fall, Wheaton North High School will open with a new look.** It has been exciting to watch each new space take shape. With the majority of the construction completed this fall, students will have access to a new Commons area and a new College and Career Resource Center, as well as an English Resource Room and a Social Studies Resource Room. The Classroom addition will be partially finished, and the new Field House will open sometime during the fall.

The new facility is outstanding and offers so much for our students! I would like to once again thank the community for this gift. It should be no surprise that there are many changes to the facility beyond the addition. First of all, the new addition (and the future classroom addition to replace the math mobiles) will cause the entire building to shift. Many teachers and departments are being relocated. The first week of school should prove interesting when everyone is lost, including the faculty and staff! The Commons area is the transition between the new and old building. The Commons will also serve as an expansion to the Student Cafeteria for juniors and seniors. All grades will have access to the Student Cafeteria, as the Commons will have a limited menu. The Courtyard will continue to be an outdoor eating space for seniors only.

The main entrance to the building will now be off of Thomas Road, where it was prior to last year. The Main Office moves to the front of the building. Student Services is also accessible from Thomas Road. Students can still be dropped off at Door 26 or on Papworth Street. However, there will now be access from the front. **Visitors should now enter the building off of Thomas Road.** You will check in at the Main Office or Student Services. Parking will still be challenging. We will have more spaces this year than last year. Again, I am asking everyone's patience as we rework the new traffic flow. Parking permits will be offered to seniors first. If there are extra spaces, juniors will be notified.

All of the above information gives you some idea about the new facility. This new space is designed to increase teaching and learning opportunities. We will continue to work diligently to offer a quality education for all students. **Wheaton North High School is a special place.** Our academic, activity, and athletic programs are designed to meet the needs of the wide range of abilities, interests, and talents of our students. I encourage everyone to become actively involved.

It is a privilege to serve the students and community of Wheaton North. We will be hosting an Open House as soon as the site is ready. I will send a voicemail message prior to the date. It is my hope that I have the opportunity to get to meet all of you throughout the school year. Until then, enjoy the remainder of your summer.

STRIVE Summary

STRIVE (Success Through Reaching Individual Expectations) had a very successful semester this past spring. The brand new after school study program was available to students from February 28 to May 26, 2005. During that time 148 students took advantage of the program at least once with 63 students attending 12 or more sessions. At the end of second semester, the number of student failures was drastically reduced. A big thanks goes to the 26 teachers who participated as tutors and several students who volunteered their time to help out as well. We are grateful to have the support of our school and district level administrators in order to make this all possible. If grant funding is approved, we hope to continue to be able to offer the program throughout the 2005 - 2006 school year.

Attention parents and students enrolled in **FALL SEMESTER DRIVER EDUCATION**

There will be a **mandatory** informational meeting, in which the student enrolled in Driver Education and at least one parent must be present. This is for FALL SEMESTER students only. The meeting will take place WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 17th at 7:00pm in the Cafeteria. Information will be passed out concerning the Rules of the Road Test, Vision Test, and the Student Driver Permit. Not attending this meeting will delay the student in obtaining his/her driving permit.

Free and Reduced Meals Information

Dear Parent/Guardian:

Children need healthy meals to learn. CUSD 200 offers healthy meals every school day. Your children may qualify for free meals or for reduced price meals. Following are some commonly asked questions:

- Do I need to fill out an application for each child?** No. Complete the application to apply for free or reduced price meals. Use only one Free and Reduced Price School Meals Application for all students in your household. We cannot approve an application that is not complete, so be sure to fill out all required information. Return the completed application to your child's school.
- Who can get free meals?** Children in households getting Food Stamps or TANF and most foster children can get free meals regardless of your income. Also, your children can get free meals if your household income is within the free limits on the Federal Income Guidelines.
- Who can get reduced price meals?** Your children can get low cost meals if your household income is within the reduced price limits on the Federal Income Chart.
- I get WIC. Can my child(ren) get free meals?** Children in households participating in WIC may be eligible for free or reduced price meals. Please fill out an application.
- Can homeless, runaway and migrant children get free meals?** Please call CUSD 200 at 630-682-2005 to see if your child(ren) qualify, if you have not been informed that they will get free meals.
- Will the information I give be checked?** Yes, we may ask you to send written proof.

- Should I fill out an application if I got a letter this school year saying my children are approved for free or reduced price meals?** Please read the letter you got carefully and follow the instructions. Call your child's school if you have any questions.
- If I don't qualify now, may I apply later?** Yes. You may apply at any time during the school year if your household size goes up, income goes down, or if you start getting Food Stamps TANF or other benefits. If you lose your job, your children may be able to get free or reduced price meals.
- What if I disagree with the school's decision about my application?** You should talk to school officials. You also may ask for a hearing by calling or writing to William R. Farley, Assistant Superintendent for Business Operations at 130 W. Park Ave., Wheaton, IL 60187 or call at 630-682-2005.
- May I apply if someone in my household is not a U.S. citizen?** Yes. You or your child(ren) do not have to be a U.S. citizen to qualify for free or reduced price meals.
- Who should I include as members of my household?** You must include all people living in your household, related or not (such as grandparents, other relative, or friends). You must include yourself and all children who live with you.
- What if my income is not always the same?** List the amount that you normally get. For example, if you normally get \$1000 each month, but you missed some work last month and only get \$900, put down that you get \$1000 per month. If you normally get overtime, include it, but only if it's steady income.
- We are in the military, do we include our housing allowance as income?** If your housing is part of the Military Housing Privatization Initiative, do not include your housing allowance as income. All other allowances must be included in your gross income.

If you have other questions or need assistance please call your child's school.

College Admission and Testing

Along with grade point average and rank, a student's standardized test score continues to be one of the major factors in determining college admission for four-year colleges and universities. The best preparation for these tests is the rigorous curriculum in CUSD 200. However there are other products, services, and courses that have proven effective in preparing students for the SAT and ACT. These include private courses specializing in test prep such as Excel Edge, Princeton Review, Kaplan and courses offered at COD and Wheaton North. Dates and cost information will be available in the fall. Finally, there are reference books, computer software, and web sites that allow students to study on their own.

The Guidance Office has mail-in registration packets for both the ACT and SAT. However, both testing companies recommend registering on-line at www.act.org for the ACT and www.collegeboard.org for the SAT. Parents and students should contact their counselor to discuss testing and other admission matters.

- All the test dates are Saturday mornings at WNHS (Except PLAN).
- All of tests (except PLAN) have a registration fee; an extra fee is required for late registration.
- Seniors considering EARLY DECISION need to pay special attention to the September 24 ACT and the October 8 SAT dates.
- Juniors who have a conflict because of an IHSA event on October 15 may be able to test at WWSHS. If this is the case, students should contact their counselor ASAP.
- Juniors should note that the PSAT is also the National Merit Scholarship qualifying test.

NEWS FROM THE GUIDANCE DEPARTMENT

School Schedule Information

Distribution of Schedules - Students who completed all registration requirements will be receiving a copy of their fall course schedule during the second week of August. Any students who do not receive their schedule should contact the Main Office as soon as possible.

Students should remember to bring their schedule with them on the first day of school, Tuesday, August 23. This schedule is the only copy students will receive. **Lost schedules will be replaced in the Guidance Office at a cost of \$5.00.** Students who find an error in their schedule should contact the Guidance Office at 784-7324/7325 to make an appointment with their counselor for a schedule correction.

Schedule changes - Schedule changes will only be accommodated for errors, level changes, and/or to drop a class for a study hall. **No schedule changes will be made for teacher preference or interest changes.**

Lunch periods - Lunch periods are **not** printed on student schedules. Students will be informed of their lunch period on the first day of school, a half-day attendance.

Grade Level classifications - Just a reminder that grade level assignments are based on credits earned at the end of each academic year as follows: freshman - less than 6 credits; sophomore - 6 credits; junior - 12 credits; and senior - 18 credits. A student's grade level is based on the criteria above, not on age or length of time in a particular grade.

Annual Follow-Up Survey

Each fall the Guidance Department conducts a survey with the previous year's graduating class (2005) to learn of their post-secondary plans. This survey is very important because the results are used to complete required reports for the State of Illinois, provide information on the WNHS profile for colleges, and to plan guidance programs. This year's survey was mailed out to all students who did not turn in a final transcript request at the end of the 2004/2005 school year. The survey (a blue postcard) was mailed out in early July and was addressed to parents or guardians to fill out just in case their graduate was away from home. Thank you for your prompt attention to this important (yet brief) survey.

Senior Conferences

All seniors will meet with their counselor in September or early October for their individual conferences. Topics covered will include class schedules, diploma requirements, and post-secondary plans. Special focus will be given to the college application process. Counselors will also review procedures for campus visits, obtaining recommendation letters, and financial aid. A special handout outlining all pertinent college application procedures will be given to students during the conference. Parents are encouraged to review this handout with their student and to contact their guidance counselor at 784-7324/7325 with any questions.

2005/2006 Counselor Assignments

Due to the retirement of Mrs. Masoncup and the resignation of Mr. Sieck, the Guidance Department welcomes Mr. Scott Lilly and Mrs. Wendy Biggs to the counseling team. New College and Career Resource Center

This fall the CCRC will move from the library to its new location in the former area of the main office. The new CCRC will house the offices of the guidance counselors, which will allow students and counselors better access to each other. Along with the counselors' offices, the CCRC will also have a computer work station, a college representative conference room (see below), study tables for students to research future plans, and resource materials with information on college and careers. We encourage all students, especially seniors, to stop in and check out the new space.

College Representative Visits

Many representatives from various colleges and universities from around the country visit Wheaton North each year. We encourage students to take advantage of this opportunity to attend college representative presentations for schools they are interested in attending. All visits will be held in the new College and Career Resource Center and will be announced on the daily announcements and posted on the Wheaton North web site. Also, a list of upcoming representative visits will be posted in the Guidance Office. Military recruiters also visit Wheaton North on a regular basis.

Wheaton North Falcon Booster Club

As you prepare to start a new school year, the Booster Club is also busy getting ready for the 2005-06 school year. We are a parent volunteer organization with the purpose of supporting all students, faculty, administration and campus facilities. With increasing costs and tighter District budgets we can help supply some of the many needs for all extra-curricular activities.

2005-06 FALCON FALL SPORTS INFORMATION BULLETIN

On behalf of the Falcon Athletic Department, we would like to invite each of our students to participate in at least one of the sports programs offered at North. This fall we have nine sports with twenty-six levels of play scheduled for competition. You are encouraged to get involved and to experience the excitement of being a Falcon athlete. Being an athlete requires commitment, dedication, and hard work. The rewards are many and the friendships made are often for life. It will also enrich your high school experience. Freshmen, we especially need your involvement in our Falcon Sports Programs. Do not wait - join a program as a freshman - be a part of our Falcon Pride!

Most of the fall sports will begin practice on Monday, August 15, 2005, with the exception of football, which begins August 10. Listed on the attached pages are some brief comments regarding practices, starting times, and location for each sport. Hopefully, all that are interested can attend the very first meeting. If you want to participate but cannot make the first meeting, please call the Athletic Office (784-7318 or 784-7319) and let us know. All participants must have a current physical, a parental permission form filled out and signed, and an emergency card for the trainer, before beginning practice. Freshmen may use their freshman physical; simply make a copy for the Athletic Office and mark it at top "Athletics". This should have been turned in at registration for the nurse's requirements. These forms can be downloaded from our web site or stop by the Athletic Office and pick them up. (Web address is wnhs.org.)

We would like to encourage you to help keep our building neat and clean, as this is your home away from home. That means no cleated shoes in the building and mud should stay outside-scrub your feet before entering the building. With everyone working together we can keep our building clean.

Our trainer, Mr. Steve Mayo, and his staff will be on duty during pre-season practices. They will do their best to provide all needed training services. If you find you are unable to come to practice or if you are ill, please call Mr. Mayo's office at 784-7388. He has Voice Mail for you to leave a message if he isn't available to take your call.

The following must be taken care of before you will be allowed to practice. If you do not meet all the requirements you may watch the others practice but you cannot participate until all forms are completed.

1. **A current sports physical.** Only freshmen may use their required freshman physical for athletics. Simply make a copy of the freshman physical and mark it "Athletics". All upperclassmen must have a current physical on file. IHSA forms are to be used for physicals and may be picked up in the Athletic Office for upperclassmen. This is a requirement of the Illinois High School Association.
2. **A white parental permission form/insurance waiver form** may also be picked up in the Athletic Office. This form must be filled out completely and signed in two places by parents and athletes.
3. **A user's fee of \$100 should be paid** in the Athletic Office for all current fall sports and the receipt shown to your coach to receive your equipment. If you plan to try out for the Volleyball, Soccer, Tennis and Golf teams, please do not pay until teams are picked. All other sports must be paid before attending the first practice or make arrangements with the athletic director, Matt Fisher.
4. **A gold emergency card** for the trainer should be turned in before practice begins.
5. **YOU MUST BE REGISTERED FOR SCHOOL BEFORE YOU CAN PARTICIPATE.**

First practice will be Monday, August 15. Meet on the track at Wheaton North at 9:00 a.m. Practice will be about two hours in length. Wear comfortable running clothes and running shoes. Report rain or shine. Bring your own water bottle. Wear sun screen.

GIRLS CROSS COUNTRY - Head Coach Ron Piro
First practice will be Monday, August 15. Meet in the front hall at Wheaton North at 8:00 a.m. Practice will be for approximately 60 to 75 minutes. Wear comfortable running clothes and running shoes. Come rain or shine. Bring your own water bottle. Wear sun screen.

FOOTBALL - Head Coach Matt Foster
Football equipment will be handed out at the following times at the football shed (located at the north end of the football field) on Monday, August 8. Varsity will pick up equipment at 8:00 a.m., Sophomores at 9:00 a.m., and Freshmen at 10:00 p.m. You may not pick up equipment before your allotted time no matter what the circumstances; it will not be available. There will be a meeting in the large auditorium at 8:00 a.m. for all levels on Tuesday, August 9. This meeting is very important. First practice will be at 8:00 a.m. on Wednesday, August 10. Please come dressed appropriately (shorts, T-shirt, gym shoes until you are requested to change) for practice. Football will practice rain or shine unless we have a storm with lightning then we will be inside on a space available basis. Bring your own water bottle. Sun screen is recommended.
